

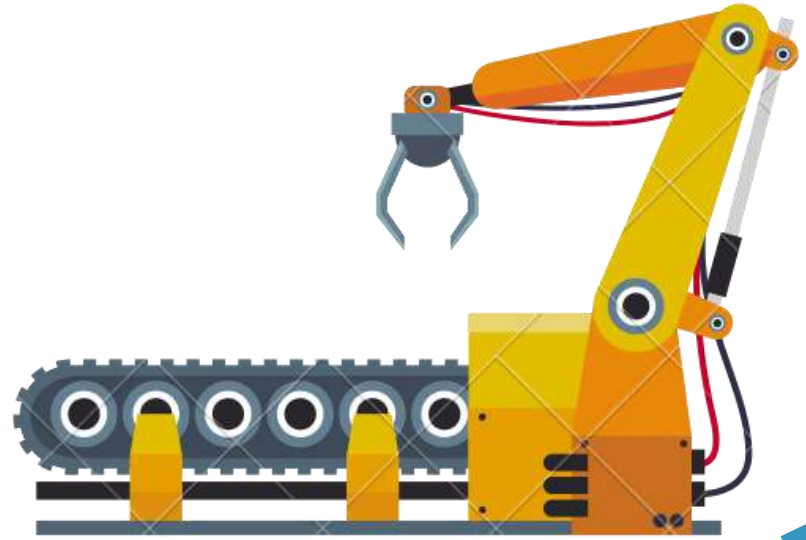






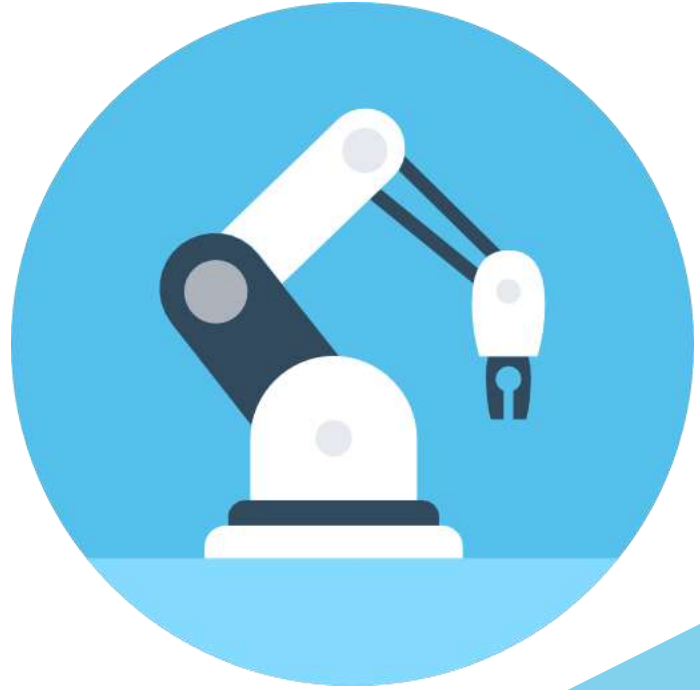
» One of the widely-spoken languages in the world

I'm not so limited in my choices of information sources. In my learning process I can use very many amount of english sources. After all, often enough, information you need available only in english.

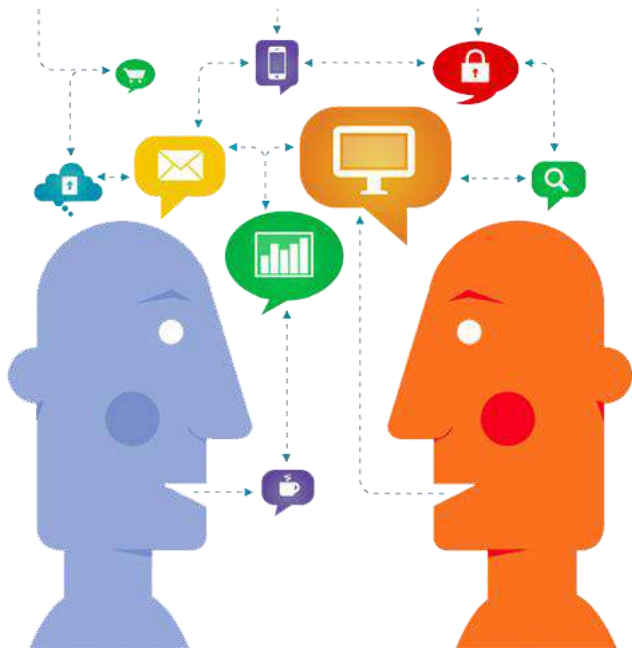


We can forget how powerful internet is and how much opportunities it offers. Especially if you know english.
